Kansas Gamma's new home promises to be the most attractive on the Hill, not only from the outside appearance but the interior arrangement and furnishings as well. Nothing has been spared to make this house a real monument to the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity at K. U., and we may look with pride upon our home as the goal towards which every man has been working since Kansas Gamma was installed here six years ago.

Our new house is a three story, Colonial structure, situated in the West Hills district which is undoubtedly the most attractive location one could desire.

The walls are finished in light tan with French windows opening towards the north, admitting light and allowing for ample ventilation. Adjoining the chapter room is the ante-room and the preparation room for convenience durinitiation service. added feature to the house will be the pressing room which is to be equipped with a new steam press for the convenience of the men in the house. There is also a large storage room for trunks, running the full length of the house. The boiler room is entirely enclosed in concrete, rendering it strictly fireproof.

The first floor includes the tains the dining hall which will reception room, lounge, living elaborate antique room, sun parlor, the house mother's suite and the servants' quarters. The floors of the main rooms will be covered with rich, Oriental rugs bearing the fraternity crest and the furniture has been especially made for us. The second and third floors are finished in oak with cream colored California sand finished plaster used throughout. There are nine study rooms with built-in wardrobes and dressers on each floor, also telephone booths and linen closets. Two spacious dormitories, one at each end of the third floor hall, will furnish sleeping quarters for fifty-five men.
