

Basket. Ball.

The ball to be an ordinary Arsociation foot ball.

The ball may be thrown in any direction with one or both

hands.

On 15 January 1892, James Naismith published his rules for the game of "Basket Ball" that he invented. The original game played under these rules was quite different from the one played today as there was no dribbling, dunking, three-pointers, or shot clock, and goal tending was legal.

1. The ball may be thrown in any direction with one or both hands.

2. The ball may be batted in any direction with one or both hands (never with fist).

3. A player cannot run with the ball, the player must throw it from the spot on which he catches it, allowance to be made for a man who catches the ball when running at a good speed.

4. The ball must be held in or between the hands; the arms or body must not be used for holding it.

5. No shouldering, holding, pushing, tripping or striking in any way the person of an opponent shall be allowed. The first infringement of this rule by any person shall count as a foul; the second shall disqualify him until the next goal is made or, if there was evident intent to injure the person, for the whole of the game. 7. If either side makes three consecutive fouls, it shall count a goal for the opponents (consecutive means son shall count as a foul, the 8. A goal shall be made when the ball is thrown or batted from the grounds into the basket and stays there (without falling), providing those defending the goal do not touch or disturb the goal. If the ball rests on the edge, and the opponent moves the basket, it shall count as a goal.

9. When the ball goes out of bounds it shall be thrown into the field and played by the first person touching it. In case of dispute the umpire shall throw it straight into the field. The thrower in is allowed five seconds, if he holds it longer, it shall go to the opponent. If any side persists in delaying the game, the umpire shall is striking at the ball with the fist, violation call a foul on them.

10. The umpire shall be the judge of the men and shall note the fouls and notify the referee when three consecutive fouls have been made. He shall have power to disqualify people according to Rule 5.

11. The referee shall be judge of the ball and shall decide when the ball is in play, in bounds, to which side it belongs, and shall keep the time. He shall decide when a goal has been made and keep account of the goals with any other duties that are usually performed by a referee.

12. The time shall be two fifteen-minute halves, with five minutes rest between.

13. The side making the most goals in that time is declared the winner. In case of a drew game may, by agreement of the captain, by continued until another goal is made. ball is thrown or batted . into the vashel

Naismith's original 1892 manuscript of the rules of basketball, one of the most expensive manuscripts in existence, is publicly displayed at Allen Fieldhouse on the campus of the University of Kansas. Naismith was the first coach in the history of Kansas Jayhawks men's basketball.



In 1923, Naismith was a founder of Sigma Phi Epsilon (SigEp) fraternity at Kansas. Initiated on February 18, 1923, prior to KU SigEp's April 23, 1923 Chartering, Naismith leads the effort with 39 "Acomas" undergraduate members to bring a SigEp Chapter to KU. Naismith, a coach and also a minister, had been impressed by the religious roots demonstrated by SigEp's Chapter at nearby Baker University. Members who were interviewed during that era remembered Dr. Naismith: "He thought sports were nothing but an avenue to keep young people involved so they could do their studies and relate to their community", and "It was really nice having someone with the caliber of Dr. Naismith be so involved ... he helped many a SigEp!"




